GENERAL ELECTION 2016 EXERCISE YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE!

Inver Grove Heights holds municipal elections on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years in conjunction with State and Federal elections. The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2016.

City's offices on the General Election ballot include:

- Mayor (*two-year term*)
- Two Council Members (*four-year term each*)

The City is divided into ten precincts. You must vote in your own precinct. Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day at the following locations:

- Precinct 1 – Amazing Grace Lutheran Church, 7160 South Robert Trail
- Precinct 2 – Inverhills Church, 8265 Babcock Trail
- Precinct 3 – National Guard Armory, 8076 Babcock Trail
- Precinct 4 – Inver Grove Heights City Hall, 8150 Barbara Ave.
- Precinct 5 – Emanuel Lutheran Church, 2075 70th St. E.
- Precinct 6 – St. Patrick's Catholic Church, 3535 72nd St. E.
- Precinct 7 – St. Patrick's Catholic Church, 3535 72nd St. E.
- Precinct 8 – River Heights Vineyard Church, 6070 Cahill Ave. E.
- Precinct 9 – Crossroads Church, 5590 Babcock Trail
- Precinct 10 – Bethesda Lutheran Church, 2855 47th St. E.

All eligible voters of the City may vote in said election at the aforesaid polling places for the voting precinct in which the voter resides. The polls will open at 7:00 a.m. and will close at 8:00 p.m. Please note Precinct 6 and 7 are combined for the 2016 State Primary and General Election.

VOTER REGISTRATIONS

Just moved to the City of Inver Grove Heights? Don't forget to register! Voter Registration cutoff for the General Election is October 18, 2016. **Before you can vote, you must register.** In Minnesota, you must register 21 days before Election Day for your name to appear on the polling place roster. If you do not meet the registration deadline you must register at your polling place on Election Day. You may register and vote in Inver Grove Heights on the next Election Day if you:

- Are a U.S. citizen
- Will be at least 18 years old on Election Day
- Will have resided in Inver Grove Heights for 20 days immediately preceding Election Day
- Have any felony conviction record discharged, expired, or completed
- Are not under court-ordered guardianship where a court has revoked your voting rights
- Have not been ruled legally incompetent by a court of law

WHEN DO I REGISTER?

Your registration remains current until you move, change your name, or do not vote for four consecutive years. You may update your registration information by completing and submitting another Voter Registration Application. You may register online at www.mnvotes.org or stop into Inver Grove Heights City Hall and we can provide you with an application. You can also register at your polling location on Election Day with proof of residency.

NEW! ABSENTEE VOTING WITHOUT ENVELOPE

New this year is the implementation of Absentee Voting without an envelope which allows the voter to complete and cast your ballot starting seven (7) days before the Election. This goes into effect on November 1, 2016 through November 4, 2016, 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Extended hours are Saturday, November 5, 2016 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. and Monday, November 7, 2016 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. The location is Inver Grove Heights City Hall, 8150 Barbara Ave.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Absentee voting opens on September 23, 2016 through November 4, 2016 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Extended hours are Saturday, November 5, 2016 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. and Monday November 7, 2016 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

REGISTERING ON ELECTION DAY

To register at the polling place on Election Day, you must have authorized proof of residence. To determine what information you need to bring with you to your polling place to register on please review the Election Day registration requirements at www.mnvotes.org or call Elections Hotline at 651-450-2463.

BOW HUNTING ORDINANCE CHANGES

The option of requiring registration for all hunters and for requiring proof of proficiency was initially introduced in 2015 but deferred until 2016, so that more information could be gathered and analyzed. To that end, a city-wide survey was completed early in 2016.

The results of the survey were shared at the May 2, 2016 City Council work session, indicating that residents still want to be able to hunt within City limits. The results also indicated that safety concerns are an issue as well, so staff was directed to research how other cities manage their registration and proficiency requirements. That information was presented to City Council for a first reading of the ordinance amendment at the July 25, 2016 meeting and staff was then directed to bring it back to Council for the 2nd and 3rd readings at the August 8, City Council meeting.

At the August 8th, 2016 City Council meeting the ordinance amendment requiring bow-hunter registration and proficiency was discussed and Council approved the 2nd reading but directed staff to bring the ordinance amendment back to Council on August 22nd with the following changes:

As of this printing, only hunters who will be hunting on someone else's property will be required to provide proof of proficiency. Property owners/tenants – and all those related individuals as defined by the ordinance – who hunt on their own property will not need to provide proof of proficiency. All hunters will still be required to register.

Further discussion about the frequency of demonstrating proficiency may occur. Staff is recommending that it be required bi-annually. For the most up-to-date information, please see the City website page at www.invergroveheights.org.

EARLY CANADA GOOSE HUNTING

The City of Inver Grove Heights is again participating in the early Canada goose hunting season for 2016. The early season is set for September 3 – September 18, 2016. The regular Canada goose hunting season runs September 24 – October 2, 2016 and October 15, 2016 – January 4, 2017.

The City will limit dates available for hunting Canada Geese to:

- September 3–4
- October 15–16
- November 19–20
- December 16–17, concluding Saturday, December 31, 2016.

The purpose of the hunt is to thin the goose population within the city. **The City Council has determined that no hunting with firearms will be permitted after December 31, 2016.**

INVER GROVE HEIGHTS' PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING NOW A LOCATION FOR "SWAP SPOT"

Inver Grove Heights residents who exchange goods bought or sold online now have a public location to make those transactions.

The City has established a "Swap Spot" exchange location in the customer parking lot of the public safety building. Swap Spots are available during regular business hours of operation at City Hall, 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., Monday – Friday, excluding holidays.

While the parking spot will be monitored by security cameras, it is not a guarantee of safety, but rather serves as an additional option when people want to schedule a legal transaction in a public place. Anyone needing immediate police presence in an emergency should call 911.

Swap Spots may be used for other legal transactions, such as exchanging property between individuals or for child custody/visitation exchanges.

CODE CORNER

QUESTION:

“When do I need to clean my furnace and ductwork?”

ANSWER:

In an interview with David Rieland, Metro Heating and Cooling, he recommended that the furnace should have the burners inspected and test the gas pressure (if necessary) at least once every two years. This would ensure that you maintain warranties, performance, and energy efficiency. Ductwork should be cleaned every five to seven years (or after any construction activity in the home) based on an individual’s allergy tolerance. One inch furnace filters should be changed every thirty days, and 4" or wider filters should be changed every three months (or as manufacturer’s recommend). Air exchanger mesh filters should be washed every thirty days with the changing of your furnace filter, and the foam filter should be washed, and submerged, every six months. Intake screens on the outside of the home should be checked in the fall and spring to ensure there are no obstructions in the intake. Humidifier water panels should be replaced at the start of every heating season. Have a topic you would like to see researched and/or discussed? COMMERCIAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

The City Council is seeking citizen input on a draft ordinance regarding commercial property maintenance. The ordinance would require that businesses adequately maintain their building exteriors, parking lots, signs, lawns, and fire protection systems.

For example, a commercial building would be required to establish a lawn within one year of completing the building and maintain it so it does not exceed eight inches in height. A parking lot would be required to be maintained free from hazardous conditions that endanger persons or property.

The city has also adopted Cartegraph, a leading operations management system. Cartegraph gives the City of Inver Grove Heights powerful tools for managing its day-to-day operations. Working in tandem, YourGOV and Cartegraph will help the City of Inver Grove Heights manage citizen requests and resolve them more efficiently than ever before.
